Community Partnerships



In February, one of Mercy's community partners, **iFM - Community Medicine**, partnered with Mercy's Mammography Van to visit The Hancock Health Clinic located in South County. This was a great event for both the Hancock Clinic as well as Mercy. Half of the women served didn't have health insurance, and wouldn't have otherwise been able to get a Mammogram.

The teamwork of multiple collaborating partners to provide services to those in need also made this day special. The Hancock School District, led by Superintendent Kevin Carl and Assistant Superintendent, Tim McInnis, have been incredible partners for iFM and the Hancock Clinic. iFM's Women's Health Program is made possible through the support of St. Anthony's /Mercy Medical Center.

iFM - Community Medicine focuses on improving the health and quality of life for disadvantaged children and families by reducing access barriers and delivery of quality health care services throughout the St. Louis Community.

Total Community Benefit \$18,731,125

Charity Care

Includes the actual cost of providing free or discounted care to persons who cannot afford to pay and who are not eligible for public programs. Charity care does not include bad debt.

Benefit: \$7,699,003

Community Outreach Services

Includes activities carried out to improve community health and services that are subsidized because they are needed in the community. Examples: education, support groups, health screenings, and immunizations.

Benefit: \$949,101

Health Professionals

Education and Research

Includes the cost of providing clinical placement for physicians, nurses and other health professionals plus the costs of the nursing anesthesia, EMS and radiology schools.

Benefit: \$3,138,529

Cash, In-Kind Donations, Workforce Enhancement and Fundraising

Includes cash, in-kind donations, fundraising costs, food & supplies to shelters, use of Mercy rooms and facilities, donated office space and recruitment of health professionals in medically underserved areas.

Benefit: \$88,595

Medicaid Subsidies

Includes the actual unpaid cost of providing care to Medicaid patients and represents the shortfall between cost of care and the payments received by the government.

Benefit: \$6,855,897
