Nearly two centuries ago, Catherine McAuley, founder of the Sisters of Mercy, devoted her life to ministering to the sick, poor and uneducated of Dublin, Ireland. In 1871, the Sisters of Mercy brought Catherine's ministry to St. Louis, and eventually expanded across Missouri and into Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma and Texas. Today, Mercy is the sixth-largest Catholic health system in the United States with more than 1,900 integrated physicians and 39,000 health care professionals caring for people in 32 hospitals and 300 outpatient facilities.
