
Map Your Migraine



- Migraine with Aura (Complicated Migraine)

 May see black dots, feel numb on one side

 of the body or have trouble speaking clearly.
- Migraine without Aura (Common Migraine)
 Pulsing or throbbing pain on one side
 of the head. Comes without warning.
- Migraine without head pain

 Dizzying aura and other visual disturbances, but no head pain.
- Retinal Migraine
 Temporary vision loss in one eye.
- Ice pick headaches
 Five to 30 seconds of severe, stabbing pain.
- Cluster headaches
 Severe headache in or around eye on one side of the head.
- Cervicogenic headache
 Pain from the neck that's felt in the head
 (referred pain).
- Hemiplegic Migraine Weakness or loss of sensation on one side of the body. May not include severe head pain.
