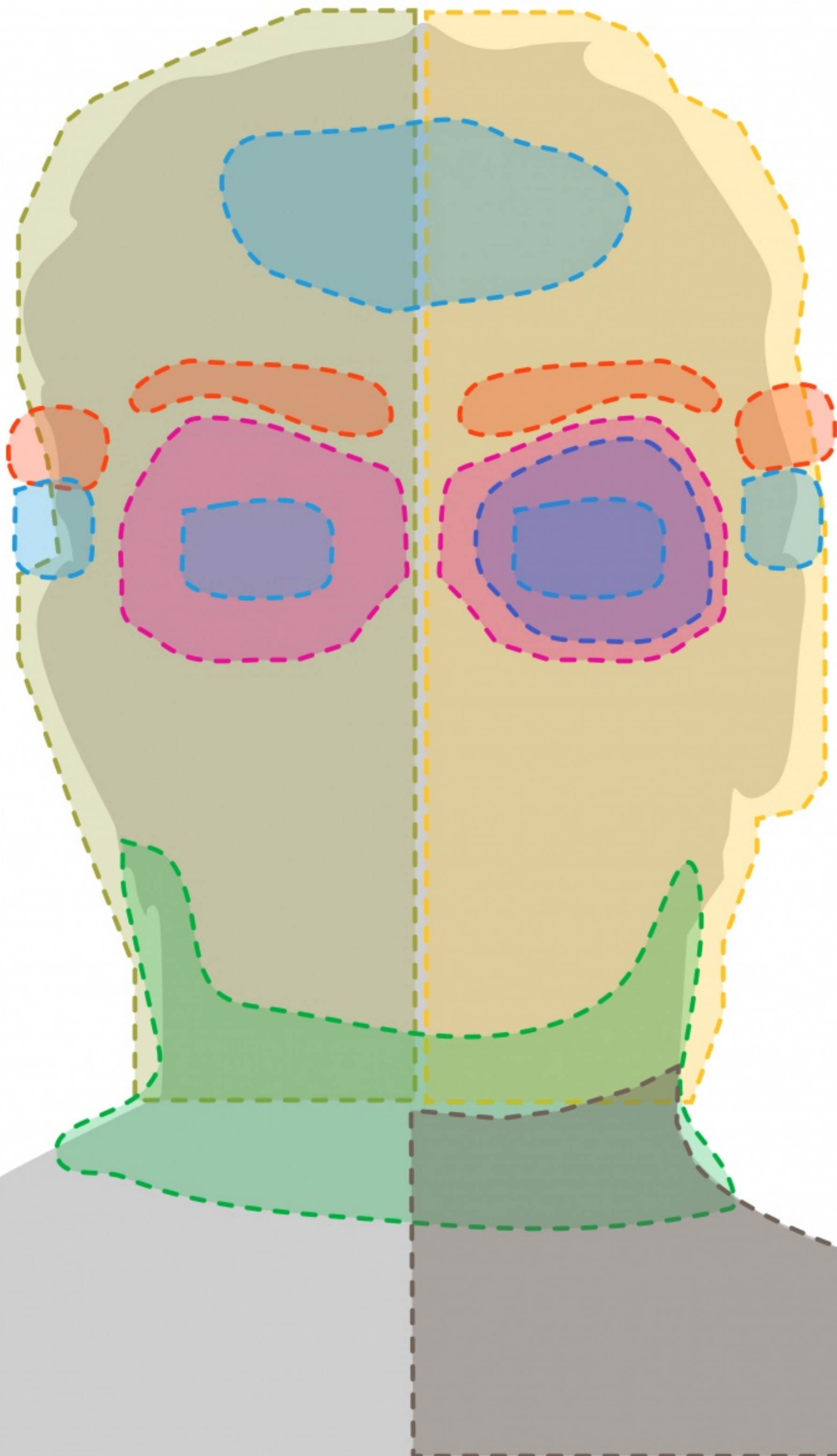


# Map Your Migraine



- Migraine with Aura (Complicated Migraine)**  
May see black dots, feel numb on one side of the body or have trouble speaking clearly.
- Migraine without Aura (Common Migraine)**  
Pulsing or throbbing pain on one side of the head. Comes without warning.
- Migraine without head pain**  
Dizzying aura and other visual disturbances, but no head pain.
- Retinal Migraine**  
Temporary vision loss in one eye.
- Ice pick headaches**  
Five to 30 seconds of severe, stabbing pain.
- Cluster headaches**  
Severe headache in or around eye on one side of the head.
- Cervicogenic headache**  
Pain from the neck that's felt in the head (referred pain).
- Hemiplegic Migraine**  
Weakness or loss of sensation on one side of the body. May not include severe head pain.
