The **CREIGHTON MODEL** is a medically standardized modification of the Billings Ovulation Method which links family planning with women's reproductive and gynecologic health. It is the only program in this field that meets the education demands of a newly-emerging allied health profession and provides a case management approach to teaching.

The CREIGHTON MODEL FertilityCare™ System and the new women's health science of NaProTechnology were developed through the research and education efforts of Thomas W. Hilgers, MD, director of the Saint Paul VI Institute for the Study of Human Reproduction and clinical professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Creighton University Medical Center.



Program Overview

- Provide comprehensive, professional, and individualized family planning services
- Help couples understand their sexuality and fertility
- Assist couples experiencing infertility in a way that is natural and cooperative
- Work in an allied health profession dedicated to ongoing research and development

Course Structure

The course is presented in two education phases and two supervised practica. Students also complete an on-site visit with their supervisor and take a final certificate examination.

Education Phase I (EPI)

Oct. 19-26, 2024 | St. Louis, MO

EPI is an eight-day immersion course focused on basic teaching skills of the Creighton Model Fertility CareTM System (CrMS). Topics include anatomy, physiology, contraception and natural methods, chart reading and correcting, use of standardized tools, system instructions and techniques of follow up.

Supervised Practicum I (SPI)

Oct. 2024 - April 2025 | Practitioner's Home Location

During SPI, students teach a minimum of six clients in their home location. Students work under the direction of a long-distance supervisor to develop basic teaching skills in the CrMS.

Education Phase II (EPII)

April 28 - May 3, 2025 | St. Louis, MO

EPII is a six-day immersion course focused on advanced teaching skills of the **CrMS**. Topics include infertility, NaProTechnology, unusual bleeding, continuous mucus, pregnancies, advanced behavioral issues and a client case review.

Supervised Practicum II (SPII)

May 2025 - Nov. 2025

Practitioner's Home Location

During SPII, students teach a minimum of 12 additional clients (18 total) in their home location. Students work under the direction of a long- distance supervisor to refine basic skills and develop advanced teaching skills in the CrMS.

On-Site Visit (OSV)

Practitioner's Home Location

During the On-Site Visit (OSV), the supervisor travels to the student's home location for two days to evaluate the student's teaching skills and conduct a client case review.

Final Certificate Examination

November 15, 2025

In order to become an independent FertilityCareTM
Practitioner, students take a final certificate examination upon completion of all program requirements.

Application Qualifications

The Mercy Fertility $Care^{TM}$ Practitioner Education Program welcomes applications from individuals with a strong motivation and commitment to exceptional Fertility $Care^{TM}$ services. Class size is limited and early submission of an application will allow adequate study time of the advance books and materials.

Prospective Practitioners must meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. Registered nurse with current license
- 2. Individual with a BA or BS degree
- 3. **Associate degree/diploma,** such as: Licensed Practical Nurse; Human Services Practitioner or the equivalent of two years of college study

Further eligibility criterion requires that the applicant does not prescribe or refer for contraceptives, does not perform or refer for sterilization or abortion, practices (uses) a natural method of fertility regulation or, if single and celibate, monitors their natural fertility and is a philosophical acceptor of natural methods.

Accreditation and Affiliation

The Mercy Fertility $Care^{TM}$ Practitioner Education Program is accredited by the American Academy of Fertility $Care^{TM}$ Professionals (AAFCP). Accredited education programs provide students with the necessary education for certification from the AAFCP.

Course Fees

All tuition costs are due upon entry into the program. A non-refundable tuition deposit is required to secure your enrollment in the class.
