The women are supported and encouraged to finish their high school education or get their GED and they also get help in finding employment and transitional housing.

Shelter for pregnant women 18 years and older and their children throughout pregnancy and until other housing is in place.

Mothers and infants that are ready to leave the shelter but need some additional hands-on support can stay in a one-bedroom unit, transitional living building for up to one year. Our Lady's Inn offers two years of aftercare continued support.

Residents learn from programs on parenting, nutrition, employment readiness, educational preparedness, smoking cessation, budgeting, domestic violence prevention, child development, building healthy relationships and more.

Women age 20 or younger who are pregnant, homeless, and/or parenting a child younger than age 5 can stay for the duration of their pregnancy and then up to a year after their baby is born.

Mothers are required to finish their high school diploma or GED program, attend a church of their choice and volunteer 4 hours a month in the community. In addition, mothers will complete parenting curriculum that includes childcare/parenting, budgeting, job skills, healthy relationships, healthy lifestyles, and and participate in bible studies.

Sparrow's Nest after care program will assist in locating transitional housing and the opportunity to scholarships for continuing education.
