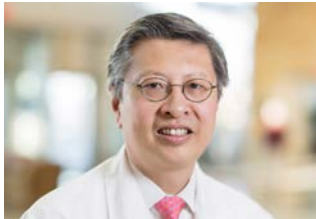

## Mercy Specialty Pharmacy: Providing Oral Oncology and Support Medications

Oral therapies for the treatment of various types of cancers are entering the market place at record speed. Over 40 percent of all new treatments are oral medications. Many targets and new options are available to treat diagnoses once only treated with IV chemotherapy. New options bring new challenges, such as insurance coverage, affordability and side effect management.

Mercy Specialty Pharmacy, located on the first floor of the David C. Pratt Cancer Center, is staffed by licensed pharmacists, as well as certified pharmacy technicians and specialty account coordinators. Our mission is to navigate the entire process of obtaining oral therapies and to eliminate any and all worries for the patient. We offer insurance benefit investigation and authorization, financial assistance and delivery options.

We work closely with other Mercy team members including physicians, nurses, social workers and financial advisors to ensure that our patients are receiving all resources

available and to provide continuity of care. We have the advantage of sharing the same medical record to assist in care coordination. Mercy Specialty Pharmacy provides a one-stop care environment. We carry almost every oral therapy unless the manufacturer limits the distribution of the medication. We dispense support medications to manage side effects as well as pain control. We also carry physician-recommended products to manage issues unique to cancer patients.

Our pharmacy team takes great pride in providing these services to our patients. This process is overwhelming to our patients as well as their caregivers, and we strive to take away the burden and worry, and to make sure nothing is overlooked. We have found that cost is the #1 worry for our patients. Our team goes to great lengths to reduce or eliminate any financial burden to our patients through co-pay assistance, financial grants and charity.

Mercy Specialty Pharmacy offers prescription counseling and resources

to manage disease state and medication therapy management, including written materials and patient care kits. Education is essential to improving outcomes through better compliance and side effect management. Oral therapies provide convenience to our patients, but adherence is harder to monitor. We regularly call patients to set up refills and contact physicians with any problems or concerns with compliance.

At Mercy Specialty Pharmacy, we are dedicated to providing quality cancer care. # Mercy Oncology Rehabilitation and Survivorship

The **Mercy Oncology Rehabilitation and Survivorship (MORS) Program** is a multi-disciplinary approach to helping cancer survivors return to their normal lives following cancer treatments. The program not only serves patients' physical needs, but also their emotional, mental and spiritual needs.

MORS has a network of providers who have

additional training in cancer care and survivorship. These providers include medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, surgeons, specialist physicians, physical therapists, occupational therapists, chiropractic physicians, dietitians, nurses, massage therapists, social workers, psychologists, pastoral providers and others.

Side effects of cancer treatments vary among patients. Mercy's Oncology Rehabilitation and Survivorship Program can help patients address these side effects and

find effective ways to deal with them in their daily lives. These side effects could include chemotherapy-induced neuropathy, cognitive issues such as memory loss, balance problems and falls, decreased appetite and weight loss, constipation or diarrhea, decreased range of motion of joints, depression and anxiety, radiation fibrosis, sleep problems, sexual dysfunction, muscle weakness, fatigue, swallowing or speech problems, and pain.

Holistic health services offered through MORS,

such as acupuncture, Healing Touch®, guided imagery and reflexology, may also help alleviate some of these side effects. Patients can find specialists and services to assist them in maximizing their quality of life. ## Physio Touch – A New Technology for Lymphedema Patients

Mercy Integrative Medicine has acquired a new technology with the **Physio Touch** device, which helps lymphedema-certified physical and occupational therapists provide enhanced treatment for their patients. Physio Touch is a negative pressure therapy device that expands and stretches the skin and tissue to help break up fibrotic tissues and scar tissue adhesions. This improves both blood flow and lymphatic flow in the area that is being treated.

Scar tissue adhesions can limit lymphatic drainage and set patients up for life-threatening infections. The new Physio Touch device is used in connection with manual lymphatic drainage massage to improve the outcome for patients with lymphedema.

Previously, patients have received the standard care of lymphatic massage. Lymphedema therapists used their hands to stretch the skin horizontally in any direction. However, they couldn't do a manual

vertical stretch of the tissue, so they had to use a cupping device to provide vertical stretch. The new Physio Touch device provides that vertical stretch and controls the exact pressure exerted, thus saving patients from bruising and preventing stress on therapists' hands. The Physio Touch also has vibrations that help reduce adhesions and fibrosis.

Therapists incorporate the Physio Touch device into the existing therapy services that patients

are receiving. There is no additional charge to the patients. The device should reduce the number of visits that are needed to obtain the best results for our lymphedema patients. It is currently available at Mercy Integrative Medicine and Therapy Services at the David C. Pratt Cancer Center at 607 S. New Ballas Road, Suite 2210, in St. Louis (63141).
