Vision Program

Mercy Therapy Services now offers a comprehensive approach to address visual changes that have occurred as a result of neurological conditions. These visual changes may include double vision, neglect, decreased eye movement such as tracking, difficulty with visual processing and changes in the field of vision. Mercy's Therapy Team customizes an approach for the patient to improve vision and/or learn to compensate for the visual deficits so they can return to activities of daily living, including driving.

The vision program may benefit those who have experienced:

- Stroke
- Traumatic brain injury
- Acquired brain injury (from cancer, tumor, post brain surgery or encephalitis)
- Multiple Sclerosis
- Parkinson's disease
- Post concussion

Or those who are experiencing the following symptoms:

- Double vision (diplopia)
- Difficulty in reading numbers, mail, newspaper, medication labels and financial information
- Difficulty with using a phone or computer
- Difficulty in filling out forms or writing checks
- Difficulty in the home with measuring liquids, threading needles, using a remote control or making home repairs

The vision program at Mercy Therapy Services includes use of the Vision Coach™, a state-of-the-art interactive light board designed to promote and enhance visual function and neuromotor abilities. Other emerging technologies and standardized assessments are also used to create a specific treatment program to meet each individual's needs.

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
